- Dalhausser and Rogers captured the gold medal at the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games.
- Dalhausser was named the most valuable player for the competition.
- Dalhausser and Rogers finished first on the **Beijing 2008 Olympic** qualifying list by winning four events during the process.
- Rogers missed qualifying for the Athens 2004 Summer Games with Sean Scott.
- Dalhausser and Rogers won the 2007 SWATCH FIVB World Championships in Gstaad, Switzerland.
- Dalhausser and Rogers won 2009 SWATCH Grand Slam gold medals in Marseille and Klagenfurt.
- Dalhausser and Rogers are the winners of nine FIVB gold medals and 38 American domestic tour titles since 2005.
- Dalhausser and Rogers rank 12th in career team FIVB earnings (US\$626,300).
- Dalhausser was named the **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** best blocker in 2006, 2007 and 2008
- Dalhausser was named the **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** best hitter in 2007, 2008 and 2009
- Dalhausser was named the **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** best offensive player in 2008 and 2009.

- Harley and Salgado won nine **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** gold medals, including six in 2008 (Australia, China, Italy, Switzerland, Mallorca and Brazil) and three in 2007 (China, Finland and Russia)
- Harley and Salgado won the 2008 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** point's title.
- Harley and Salgado are 19th in career **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** team earnings (US\$511,000).
- Harley has also won **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** gold medals with Para Ferreira (2002 Berlin), Franco Neto (2003 Berlin), Benjamin Insfran (2005 Montreal) and Alison Cerutti (2009 Shanghai and Myslowice).
- Harley ranks eighth in career FIVB earnings with US\$647,113.
- Harley was named the **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** most outstanding player in 2008 and shared the honor in 2009 with Richardo Schuil of The Netherlands.
- Harley was named the **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** most inspiration player in 2009.
- Salgado ranks 32nd in career FIVB earnings with US\$352,625.
- When Salgado won his first international Beach Volleyball title (21 years, 1 months, 8 days), he became the fourth youngest player to win a SWATCH gold medal behind Brazilians Andre Lima (20 years, 10 months, 29 days), Pedro Cunha (21, 0, 3) and Guilherme Marques (21, 1, 3).
- Salgado has won more **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** gold medals before his 24th birthday than any other player except for Brazilian rival Emanuel Rego, who won 11 FIVB titles before his 24th birthday.
- Salgado's mother (Isabel, one gold, six FIVB medals) and two sisters (Carolina and Maria Clara, one gold, six bronze medals) have competed on the FIVB Beach Volleyball tour.
- Salgado captured three "junior" FIVB world titles, including the U-21 gold medals in 2003 (with Pedro Cunha) and 2006 (with Bruno Oscar Schmidt), and a U-18 crown in 2002 (with Ian Borges).

- Brink and Reckermann are competed together for the first-time in 2009.
- Brink and Reckermann won four SWATCH gold medals in 2009 with nine "final four" finishes together in 12 events.
- Brink and Reckermann won a record 25-straight SWATCH matches in 2009 to break the FIVB record of 22-straight wins by Emanuel Rego and Jose Loliola in 1999. 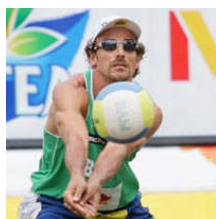
