

Phuket Thailand Open powered by PTT, Karon Beach, Phuket, Thailand, November 2-7, 2010

Updated on **November 1, 2010**, this fact sheet provides information on the FIVB and the 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour**. The US\$6.83-million **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** is scheduled over an eight-month period starting in April in Brazil and ending in November in Thailand. The US\$190,000 **Phuket Thailand Open powered by PTT** is the 15th and final women's event on the 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** calendar. - After staging women's FIVB Challenger/Satellite events in Pattaya (2001), Bangkok (2005) and Phuket (2005), Thailand will be hosting a women's event on the 2009 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** calendar for the fifth-straight year. The 2005 Phuket stop served as a prelude to the inaugural SWATCH stop in Thailand in 2006 where the competition was part of the Andaman Festival to mark the first anniversary of the Tsunami of 2004. Jen Kessy and Heather Lowe won the 2001 Pattaya event for the United States while China's Linjun Ji and Whenhui You captured the Bangkok stop. Lijun Ji was 18 years old when she won the event to become the youngest player ever to win "any" international Beach Volleyball event at the time. Eiko Koizumi and Shinako Tanaka captured Japan's first-ever international Beach Volleyball gold medal by winning the 2005 Phuket event. After upsetting Olympic and world champions Misty May-Treanor and Kerri Walsh of the United States in the semi-finals, then 17-year old Chen Xue and her then 21-year old partner Xi Zhang upset Chinese rivals Jia Tian and Jie Wang for the 2006 gold medal. May-Treanor and Walsh maintained their podium spot in 2007 by defeating American rivals Nicole Branagh and Elaine Youngs in the finals. The United States continued its gold medal ways in 2008 and 2009 with Kessy and April Ross winning the titles by capturing All-American finales with Tyra Turner an opponent in both. Turner and Branagh dropped an 18-21, 21-14 and 15-12 decision to Kessy and Ross in the 63-minute 2008 gold medal match. Turner and Angie Akers were the 2009 title victims by dropping a 21-12 and 21-17 match in 37 minutes to Kessy and Ross. Both Kessy and Ross have played in all four SWATCH stops in Phuket as both have compiled 16-4 match marks. Kessy placed 13th in the 2006 **Phuket Thailand Open** with Rachel (Wacholder) Scott before teaming with Ross to finish ninth in 2007. Ross and Nancy (Mason) Reynolds finished 17th in the 2006 event after qualifying for the Main Draw.

- The women's **Phuket Thailand Open** starts November 2 (Tuesday) and concludes November 7 (Sunday). The winning team will share the \$30,000 first-place prize. Here is the schedule:

- A total of 73 women's teams from 28 countries have initially entered the **Phuket Thailand Open** (as of November 1, 2010), including **Australia, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, China, the Czech Republic, Finland, France, Germany, Great Britain, Greece, Italy, Japan, Kazakhstan, Malaysia, The Netherlands, Poland, Puerto Rico, Russia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Thailand, Ukraine, the United States, Vanuatu and Venezuela.**
- The **Phuket Thailand Open** will be the 217th women's event on the **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** (Open, Grand Slam, Olympic and Goodwill). The first women's **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** event was played August 14-16, 1992 at Almeria, Spain.
- The 14-event men's 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** season concluded at the end of August in The Netherlands.

- The television coverage for the 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** will feature 55 broadcast companies across the world. The coverage covers six macro-regions (Africa, Asia, Europe, North America, South America and the Middle East) with IMG the FIVB's partner for TV distribution and production. A total of 134 "live" matches and 21 highlight programs have been and will be produced and distributed throughout the season offering increased access to each **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** event. The 2009 international Beach Volleyball season saw an increase in international broadcasters from 24 in 2008 to 39 in 2009 when more than 1,600 total hours of primary footage of events were broadcast around the world.
- A new Mikasa ball, the VLS 300, is being used after being introduced at 2009 season-ending events in Sanya and Phuket.

WORLD TOUR UPDATE - The 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** calendar concludes this week in Thailand as the 17-site, 14-country international Beach Volleyball circuit with \$6.83-million in prize money returns to Phuket for the fifth-straight season for a women's-only event on Karon Beach. The US\$190,000 **Phuket Thailand Open powered by PTT** will start Tuesday with Country Quota playoff matches to set the field for Wednesday's Qualification Tournament where eight Beach Volleyball pairs will advance to Thursday's opening Main Draw rounds featuring a 32-team, double-elimination format. The medal matches are set for Sunday on Karon Beach. After not playing in last week's event in China, five-time **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** champions Juliana Felisberta Silva and Larissa Franca of Brazil are scheduled to headline the **Phuket Thailand Open** field where seven of the eight top-ranked teams in the world will be competing for the \$30,000 first-place prize. Juliana and Larissa have won seven **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** gold medals this season to become the winningest team in international history as the Brazilians have combined to capture 36 titles since forming their partnership in 2004. Juliana and Larissa have amassed \$351,300 in earnings for 12 events in 2010 with a 70-7 match mark. China's Chen Xue and Xi Zhang, who captured the inaugural **Phuket Thailand Open**, have claimed three **SWATCH** gold medals this season and enter this week's event as the third-ranked team on the FIVB tour behind Brazilians Maria Antonelli and Talita Antunes. Xue and Zhang, who snapped Juliana and Larissa's 40-match winning streak this season by defeating the Brazilians for a Finnish FIVB title, captured the bronze medal at the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games. After a pair of Chinese teams competed in the finals of the inaugural **Phuket Thailand Open** with Xue and Zhang topping the podium with a win over compatriots Jia Tian and Jie Wang, American pairs have placed 1-2 in the next three Karon Beach finales led by Jen Kessy and April Ross, the reigning FIVB world champions. Two-time Olympic and three-time world champions Misty May-Treanor and Kerri Walsh captured by the 2007 **Phuket Thailand Open** gold medal by defeating American rivals Nicole Branagh and Elaine Youngs in the finals. Kessy and Ross won the 2008 crown by beating Branagh and Tyra Turner followed by a 2009 title win over Turner and Angie Akers. Kessy and Ross will be in the 2010 **Phuket Thailand Open** along with Sara Goller/Laura Ludwig of Germany and the Brazilian Salgado sisters (Carolina and Maria Clara) as all three teams competed in last week's **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** "final four" in China with Xue and Zhang. Xue and Zhang, who have competed in the last five **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** gold medal matches in Poland, Norway, Finland, The Netherlands and China, defeated Germany's Sara Goller and Laura Ludwig 22-20 and 22-20 in the 45-minute Sanya finale this past Sunday. Xue and Zhang's other 2010 gold medal finish was at the Russian Grand Slam in June where the Chinese defeated Kessy and Ross in Moscow. Goller and Ludwig defeated Kessy and Ross 21-14 and 21-14 in the 39-minute Sanya semi-finals as the German pair posted three wins last week over American teams, including victories over Akers/Turner and Branagh/Walsh. Kessy and Ross rebounded to win their third-straight medal in Sanya by defeating the Brazilian Salgado sisters (Carolina and Maria Clara) 21-19 and 21-14 in the 45-minute bronze medal match. With the 2010 **Phuket Thailand Open** being the 15th and final stop for women on the **SWATCH FIVB World Tour**, the men's 14-event calendar concluded at the end of August where teams from the United States dominated the men's international Beach Volleyball competition by winning 10 events, including nine gold medal finishes for circuit champions Phil Dalhausser and Todd Rogers.
