



FACT SHEET – \$300,000 FIVB Dela Beach Open The Hague, Netherlands, January 2-7, 2018

Updated on **December 31, 2017**, this fact sheet provides information on the Fédération Internationale de Volleyball and the 2018 FIVB Beach Volleyball calendar. The 2018 FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour continues with the starred classification of its events, with three five-star events, all of which are the Swatch Major Series, eleven four-star events, five three-star events, five two-star events, and 17 one-star events, along with the Swatch FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour Finals. One FIVB Age Group World Championships for players under the age of 19 will also be held. The 2018 World Tour began in September of 2017 in France and concludes in August in Germany. 2018 marks the 32nd anniversary of the first FIVB Beach Volleyball event held February 17-22, 1987 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Four events played in 2017: France (Montpellier), China (Qinzhou), Netherlands (Aalsmeer), and Australia (Sydney), are part of the 2018 FIVB World Tour.

- The double-gender \$300,000 Dela Beach Open is a Four-Star event and is the fifth men’s and fourth women’s event on the 2018 FIVB World Tour. The FIVB returns to the Netherlands for the ninth time overall with The Hague hosting the first men’s and women’s events in 2009. - January 2-7, The Hague, Men and Women, \$300,000 – Sydney is hosting its 15th and 16th FIVB Beach Volleyball events. The event will be held at Sportcampus Zuiderpark in an indoor facility. Netherlands has hosted 16 previous FIVB World Tour events with The Hague hosting double-gender events beginning in 2009 as well as playing host to the 2015 World Championships along with the cities of Amsterdam, Apeldoorn, and Rotterdam. Netherlands will also host a men’s-only one-star even in March. Netherlands has won four previous medals on its country’s soil, a men’s gold and two silver medals and a women’s gold medal.
- The FIVB Dela Beach Open starts January 2 and concludes January 7. The winning teams from each gender will share the \$20,000 first-place prize. Here is the tentative schedule:
 - Wednesday, January 2 Women’s Country Quota Matches
 - Wednesday, January 3 Men’s and Women’s Qualifying Matches
 - Thursday, January 4 Men’s Qualifying Matches and Women’s Main Draw Pool Play Matches
 - Friday, January 5 Men’s and Women’s Main Draw Pool Play Matches
 - Saturday, January 6 Men’s Quarterfinal Matches and Women’s Quarterfinal and Semi-Final Matches
 - Sunday, January 7 Men’s Semi-Finals and Medal Matches and Women’s Medal Matches
- A total of 153 teams from 42 countries (79 men’s teams from 34 countries and 74 women’s teams from 33 countries) are entered into the FIVB Dela Beach Open (as of December 31, 2017), including Argentina (1 men’s team, 0 women’s teams), **Australia** (2,0), **Austria** (4,2), **Belarus** (1,0), **Belgium** (1,1), **Brazil** (3,4), **Canada** (2,1), **Cyprus** (1,1), **Czech Republic** (4,4), **Denmark** (2,2), **England** (2,1), **Estonia** (1,0), **Finland** (1,2), **France** (3,2), **Germany** (1,3), **Greece** (0,1), **Hungary** (0,1), **Iran** (3,0), **Italy** (3,4), **Japan** (3,4), **Latvia** (3,1), **Lithuania** (1,3), **Netherlands** (7,7), **Norway** (3,2), **Poland** (4,2), **Portugal** (0,1), **Qatar** (1,0), **Romania** (0,1), **Russia** (3,4), **Scotland** (0,1), **Serbia** (1,1), **Slovakia** (0,1), **Slovenia** (1,1), **South Africa** (1,0), **Spain** (0,1), **Sweden** (3,4), **Switzerland** (2,2), **Thailand** (0,2), **Turkey** (2,0), **Ukraine** (3,1), **United States** (5,6), and **Venezuela** (1,0).
- The FIVB Dela Beach Open is the 372nd men’s and 336th women’s event on the FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour (open, grand slam, Olympic and Goodwill). The first men’s FIVB World Tour event was played February 17-22, 1987 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil and the first women’s event was played August 14-16, 1992 at Almeria, Spain.

2018 FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour Men's & Women's Highlights

The 2018 FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour features US\$6.97 million in prize money, with three Swatch Major Series five-star events, eleven four-star events, five three-star events, five two-star events, and 17 one-star events, along with the Swatch FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour Finals. One age-group FIVB World Championships, for players under the age of 19 will also be played. The 2018 FIVB World Tour began in September of 2017 and concludes in August, 2018. This year marks the 32nd anniversary of the first FIVB beach volleyball event held February 17-22, 1987 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. The gold medal was won by USA's Sinjin Smith/Randy Stoklos. The men's World Tour began in 1989, the women's in 1992. Smith/Stoklos were the champions of the inaugural season in 1989-90.

- The international beach volleyball circuit visits 40 sites in 27 countries over an eleven-month period spanning from September, 2017 to August, 2018.
- The 2018 FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour features 36 men's and 37 women's events within the all five confederations (African, Asian, European, North American, and South American), offering US\$6.97 million in prize money.
- All three five-star events and the Swatch FIVB World Tour Season Final will be for both genders. The combined purse for each of the five-star events is \$600,000 and the total purse will be \$800,000 for the Swatch FIVB World Tour Season Final.
- The three five-star events are all FIVB Major Series events, two of which returned to their 2017 sites in United States (Fort Lauderdale) and Switzerland (Gstaad). The new venue for 2017 is Vienna, Austria.
- The showcase event on the 2018 FIVB World Tour is the Swatch FIVB World Tour Season Final, which will be played in Hamburg, Germany from August 14-19.
- Ten of the eleven four-star events will be for both genders, while the event in Doha, Qatar will be for men only. The double-gender events will be played in Netherlands (The Hague), China (Xiamen and Yangzhou), United States (Huntington Beach), Brazil (Itapema), Czech Republic (Ostrava), Poland (TBD), Portugal (Espinho), Japan (Tokyo), and Russia (Moscow). The purse for the four-star events will be \$150,000 per gender.
- The three-star events have a purse of \$100,000 for each single-gender event and \$75,000 per gender for the combined events. The first event for both genders was in China (Qinzhou), and the other three for both genders will be held in Turkey (Mersin), Switzerland (Lucerne), and Morocco (Agadir). The event in Iran (Kish Island) will be for men only.
- The two-star events have a purse of \$50,000 each, either split between two genders or paid to a single gender. The first double-gender event was held in Australia (Sydney) while the next two will be in China (Jinjiang) and Singapore. Nanjing, China and Nantong, China will hold women's-only events.
- The one-star events offer a purse of \$10,000 per gender, with the first single-gender event played in France (Montpellier) in September, 2017 for men only. The other single-gender events for women will be held in Vietnam (Tuan Chau Island), Monaco, and Korea (Daegu and Ulsan), while the events for men-only will be played in Oman and the Netherlands (Aalsmeer). Aalsmeer also hosted a double-gender one-star event in October, 2017. The other double-gender events will be held in Australia (Shepparton), Thailand (Satun and Bangkok), Malaysia (Langkawi), Philippines (Manila), Turkey (Aydin, Alanya, and Samsun), and India (Koichi)
- The 2018 FIVB Beach Volleyball calendar also includes the FIVB Age Group World Championships for players under the age of 19 in China (Nanjing) from July 11-16. FIVB age-group worlds for U21 and U19 have been held for over a decade, once for U17 and two times for U23.
- France opened the FIVB World Tour calendar for the first time in the 32 year history of the tour with the men's-only FIVB Montpellier One Star from September 7-9, 2017. The first 2018 five-star event will be in the United States (Fort Lauderdale) from February 27-March 4. The first four-star event will be held in the Netherlands (The Hague) from January 3-7, the first three-star event was played in China (Qinzhou) from October 11-15, 2017, the first two-star event was held in Australia (Sydney) from November 22-26, 2017, and the first one-star event was held in France (Montpellier) on September 7-9, 2017.
- Red Bull Media House has the exclusive distribution media rights for the 2018 FIVB World Tour.
- For the ninth straight year, the tour is exclusively using the Mikasa VLS300 ball.
