

## Olympic Beach Volleyball qualifiers change

### Time for reflection

**W**ith Executive Committee and Board of Administration meetings set to take place in the Dominican Republic this month it gives me a chance to reflect on my work of the past year. For me, there is only one criterion to evaluate the FIVB President's work and that is your satisfaction.

The satisfaction of the Executive Committee and the Board of Administration, the satisfaction of the Continental Confederations, as well as of the National Federations, our players, officials and members of the FIVB family.

I fear neither different opinions nor opposition, which would remind me that I still have shortcomings, which could cause discontent. I have to work hard.

Following a year of rethinking in 2008, we have to continue to take the initiative of introducing necessary reforms to keep up the development of the FIVB.

In summary, these are some of the main topics and what we have done:

- \* We introduced some new reforms in the FIVB competition regulations in favour of the developing National Federations.
  - \* We delegated some executive responsibilities for FIVB projects and competitions to Continental Confederations, accompanied with strict monitoring, auditing systems and necessary financial support.
  - \* Substantial increase of investment in Volleyball and in Beach Volleyball in favour of the National Federations through Continental Confederations.
  - \* To integrate Volleyball and Beach Volleyball and pay more attention to the development of Beach Volleyball at the continental level.
  - \* Good collaboration with the IOC, ASOIF, ISFs and good relations with local public authorities.
- These are tasks to be implemented continuously throughout this year.

■ **The FIVB has announced a major change to the FIVB Beach Volleyball World Cup, with the competition splitting in two and changing name - the Continental Beach Volleyball Cup and FIVB Beach Volleyball World Cup Olympic Qualification - in an effort to facilitate the implementation of a more universal Olympic system and better illustrate the nature of the tournament.**

With the FIVB Beach Volleyball World Cup launched in 2009 as an Olympic qualify-

ing event for continents, the Continental Beach Volleyball Cup will now represent the subzone, zone and continental finals while the FIVB Beach Volleyball World Cup Olympic Qualification tournament will be a stand-alone event staged from June 25-July 1, 2012.

"The change in name better illustrates what the event is all about," FIVB Executive Vice-President and Beach Volleyball Commission President Dr. Ary Graça said.

## FIVB World Grand Prix passes 150-day mark



March 9 marked just 150 days until the FIVB World Grand Prix officially begins and many teams are already drawing up plans on ways they can claim victory at the 18th edition of the tournament which runs from August 6-29.

The locations for all preliminary rounds of the competition were confirmed on January 29, with Ningbo, China the hosts for the final round for the second time after hosting the 2007 contest, which was won by the Netherlands.

And whilst the venues prepare to host eager Volleyball fans, players and coaches prepare to battle it out across the globe. Brazil will begin the competition as one of the favourites following an inspired display in last year's tournament. However despite their current form, a number of other sides are looking to dethrone the defending champions.

Italy had a marvellous season last year even though they missed out on qualification for the FIVB World Grand Prix. A solid display in Japan in November saw the European champions pick up their first FIVB World Grand Champions Cup title on their debut, beating Brazil in straight sets (25-21, 25-23, 25-21) along the way.

## Egypt girls' win ticket to Youth Olympic Games

The Egyptian girls' Volleyball team booked their ticket to the Youth Olympic Games in Singapore after winning the African Qualification tournament at Cairo Stadium on March 28, beating Rwanda 3-0 (25-20, 25-12, 25-11) in their final match.

Tunisia finished second after they toppled South Africa in straight sets (25-11, 25-13, 25-16), while Kenya

came third after beating DR Congo 3-2 (21-25, 25-22, 20-25, 25-11, 15-9).

Egypt finished top after winning all of their five games in the tournament and will travel to the Youth Olympic Games from August 14-26, joining Belgium, Peru and hosts Singapore who have already qualified for the tournament along with the NORCECA and Asia continental qualifiers which are yet to be decided.

## SWATCH FIVB World Tour 2010 returns

**A number of fascinating storylines have been laid out ahead of the first SWATCH FIVB World Tour event in Brasilia, Brazil from April 19-25 with the 24th-season of competition already promising to be as exciting as previous seasons.**

For the men, fans are already anticipating further success from the two top-rated European teams Julius Brink and Jonas Reckermann of Germany and Reinder Nummerdor and Richard Schuil of the Netherlands

Brink and Reckermann are the defending SWATCH FIVB World Tour champions as the Germans became the first European men's team to claim the season point's title since 1995 as Brazil have dominated the top spot for 13 of the past 14 seasons. Brink and Reckermann claimed victories on four international podiums in 2009, including winning the gold medal at the SWATCH FIVB World Championships in Stavanger, Norway.

Nummerdor and Schuil won the last three men's gold medals in 2009 in Finland, the Netherlands and China and are expected to rejoin the tour just as strongly as they left it last Autumn. The Dutch pair has competed in both the Volleyball and Beach Volleyball Olympics as Schuil won a gold medal at the Atlanta 1996 Summer Games. Nummerdor and Schuil placed fifth in the Beach Volleyball Olympics in Beijing.

Headlining the changes for the Brazilian tandems is the split of Athens 2004 Olympic champions Emanuel Rego and Ricardo Santos who will be playing with new partners in 2010. After Emanuel and Ricardo ranked as the top team on the SWATCH FIVB World Tour for the 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2007 seasons, their play was hampered by injuries the last two years.

For the start of the 2010 season, Emanuel will be playing with Alison Cerutti with Ricardo teaming with Pedro Salgado. Marcio Araujo and Fabio Magalhaes, the Beijing 2008 Olympic silver medal winners after defeating Emanuel and Ricardo in the semi-finals, have also split for the 2010 campaign.

Marcio Araujo will play with Joao Maciel and Fabio will be paired with Harley Marques. Harley and Salgado teamed to win the 2008 SWATCH FIVB World Tour point's title. Alison and Harley placed second on the 2009 SWATCH FIVB World Tour and also captured the silver medal at the 2009 SWATCH FIVB World Championships.

The return of two-time Olympic and three-time world champion Misty May-Treanor of the United States is already one of the most highly anticipated storylines for women as she will start the 2010 season competing with Nicole Branagh. Kerri Walsh, May-Treanor's long-time partner, is sitting out her second-straight SWATCH season due to child birth.

Juliana Felisberta Silva and Larissa Franca return as the top women's team on the SWATCH FIVB World Tour as the Brazilians have won four of the last five circuit championships. In addition to compatriots Maria Antonelli and Talita Antunes, Juliana and Larissa's other top challengers in 2010 are Americans Jen Kessy and April Ross.

With 29 career SWATCH gold medals together, Juliana and Larissa are seven

titles away from bettering May-Treanor/Walsh's record 35 SWATCH titles together. The Brazilians won eight of the 16 women's titles in 2009 with Talita and Antonelli capturing four gold medals last season and Kessy and Ross claiming three titles.

The 2010 SWATCH FIVB World Tour calendar is highlighted by six Grand Slam events sandwiched between the open tournaments taking place on 17 sites in 14 countries over an eight-month period featuring 15 women's and 14 men's competitions.

Mr. Wei joined 50 participants representing a total of 25 countries at the Olympic training centre "Giulio Onesti" located in the suburbs of the Italian capital, Rome.

## China name Wang Baoquan as new women's coach



Former Chinese international men's player Wang Baoquan was appointed as the new coach of China's women's team, replacing Cai Bin on March 25, just five months before the FIVB World Grand Prix. Xu Li, Vice-President of the Chinese Volleyball Association also revealed that Hu Jin, two-time former national coach, will also become the team manager.

Baoquan moves from a successful posting as head coach at the Tianjin women's club where he won an unprecedented seven Chinese National League Championships.

"I know very well that the Chinese women's national team is at a very difficult stage and we need time to make improvements," said the 45 year-old, who was a member of the China men's team from 1989 to 1991.

### Fiji aim for SWATCH FIVB Youth World Championships

Tomasi Katonivaliku, the Fijian Beach Volleyball Administrator, has confirmed that the national under-19 squad will be taking part in the SWATCH FIVB 2010 Youth World

Championships due to be held later this year from July 27 to August 1 in Porto, Portugal. It will be the first time Fiji has participated in a FIVB Beach Volleyball event.

## Al Ahly of Egypt enters the records book and returns the Men's Arab Club Champs to Africa



Egyptian side Al Ahly added another trophy to their cabinet after they clinched the 28th Men's Arab Club Championship following a 3-1 (23-25, 25-16, 25-21, 25-16) victory over Hilal of Saudi Arabia in a thrilling final at Cairo Stadium on March 8. It is the sixth title for the Egyptian

champions, a record for the competition, and adds to their eight African Club Champions Cups, another continental record.

Both teams delivered a fantastic performance in the final but Ahly proved that their experience was too much, winning the match in 99 minutes. After Hilal picked up the first set, the

Egyptian champions came back to win three successive sets thanks in part to the emergence of opposite Ahmed Salah who was also chosen the best server and the skill of the national team setter Abdalla Ahmed.

### Nigeria win Beach Volleyball Tournament in Niger

Nigerian pair Kayode and Goodluck were victorious in the second edition of the West African Beach Volleyball tour in March, beating Yaoudima and Moctar 2-0 (21-14, 21-18) in the final in Niamey, Niger.

The tournament, attended by the Minister of Youth and Sports Brigadier General Oumar Mai Manga and President the Zone 3 Volleyball Mr. Sawadogo Issyaka, is the second leg of the tour.

Elsewhere the Benin B and A teams finished third and fourth respectively with Niger's B Team ranking fifth ahead of Mali.



## Volleyball returns to the South American Games after 28 years



Medellin, Colombia became the capital of sport in South America from March 20-30 as the town hosted the IX edition of the South American Games, which saw the return of Volleyball for the first time in 28 years and the introduction of Beach Volleyball.

Brazil, Argentina and Venezuela were the main protagonists of the Volleyball and Beach Volleyball tournaments, with each competition regarded as one of the highlights of the Games.

In the men's edition, Argentina beat Venezuela 3-1 (20-25, 25-15, 25-21, 25-15) in the final to claim the gold medal whilst hosts Colombia overcame Chile 3-1 (25-21, 20-25, 25-18, 25-19) to pick up bronze. Meanwhile, in the women's category, Brazil and Argentina battled for first place, with the Brazilians securing a 3-0 (25-22, 25-17, 25-15) victory with the bronze going to Peru after they beat Colombia 3-0 (25-17, 28-26, 25-22).

In the men's Beach Volleyball tournaments, Venezuela's Igor Hernández and Jesús Villafaña won gold after defeating Julio Bardales and Daniel Maldonado from Ecuador 2-0 (21-13, 21-13). Bronze went to Esteban and Marco

Grimalt from Chile, who eventually edged out Colombian duo Yhan Cuesta and Jorge Cabrera by 2-1 (21-15, 21-19, 15-10).

In the women's category, Fabi and Julia Schmidt, from Brazil, overcame Colombian sisters Andrea and Claudia Galin-

do, 2-1 (15-21, 21-13, 15-10) conquering the South American Games title for Brazil in the process. Bronze went to Venezuela's Karelys Mosquera and Lili Valera who beat Argentina's Gabriela Albano and Luciana Forguez 2-0 (21-19, 21-19).

## Serbia Volleyball Federation donates over 5,000 new balls to schools



Pupils from 441 Serbian schools received 5,500 Mikasa Volleyballs on March 19 as part of the Serbian Government initiative called "Volleyball Tomorrow – Balls for Victory."

A special event at the Grand Stage in Smederevo was held in celebration of the scheme and was attended by members of

the Serbia Volleyball Federation and sponsors VIP Mobile.

Two thousand students attended the event from 24 schools and were greeted by Mr. Goro Redzic, President of the Assembly in the City of Smederevo, Mr. Aleksandar Boricic, FIVB Executive Vice-President and President of the Serbia Volleyball Federation and Mr. Alexander Sperl, President of the Executive Board for VIP Mobile.

## German legend Grün honoured with award

Ex-German Volleyball legend and FIVB World Championship 2006 participant Angelina Grün was presented with a special recognition award on March 8 for her services to the sport by the Germany Volleyball Association.

Grün, who also played in the 2002, 2003 and 2004 FIVB World Grand Prix finishing with a bronze medal on her first outing, was given the award by Germany Volleyball Association President Werner von Moltke who said that Grün had been an inspiration to many.

Grün is set to take part at the SWATCH FIVB World Tour Brasilia Open starting on April 19-25.

## Unbeaten CSKA Sofia wins women's title and Cup in Bulgaria

Bulgaria's women's club team of CSKA Sofia rounded off a brilliant season on March 18 as they won the National Championship title following a victory over Maritsa.

Earlier this year CSKA also won the National Cup after defeating Levski Siconco Sofia 3-0 (25-19, 25-17, 25-15) securing an outstanding double.



## Canadians Reader and Sewell take gold in the Cayman Islands



SWATCH FIVB World Tour duo Martin Reader and Ray Sewell from Canada defeated Puerto Rico's Orlando Irizarry and Joseph Gil 2-1 (21-17, 18-21, 15-8) to claim the men's gold medal on the opening leg of the 2010 NORCECA Beach Volleyball Circuit in the Cayman Islands on March 21.

Puerto Rico's Yarleen Santiago and Darlam Acevedo picked up the women's gold after their 2-0 (21-14, 21-18) victory over Brooke Langston and Heather Lowe of USA in the final.

Both men's finalists had a tough battle in the semifinal phase as the experienced Canadians prevailed against compatriots Maverick Match and Ben Saxton 2-1 (11-21, 21-18, 15-10) while the Puerto Ricans edged Jeff Moran and Ivan Mercer of USA 2-1 (14-21, 21-14, 15-10).

Elsewhere Santiago and Acevedo recorded a 2-0 (21-16, 21-18) semifinal victory against Jamie Broder and Kristina Valjas of Canada whilst Langston and Lowe claimed a 2-0 (21-17, 21-18) victory over Mexico's Martha Revuelta and Vanessa Virgen.
