- Jennifer Kessy and April Ross have teamed together for four-plus seasons beginning in 2007. They have played 48 FIVB events together.
- Jennifer is playing in her 25th FIVB Beach Volleyball Swatch World Tour medal match with eight gold medals, seven silver medals, five bronze medals, and four 4th place finishes.
- April is playing in her 24th FIVB Swatch World Tour medal match with eight gold medals, seven silver medals, five bronze medals, and three 4th place finishes.
- Jennifer and April rank fifth in FIVB Swatch World Tour women's team gold medals with eight including two in 2008, three in 2009, and two in 2010.
- After failing to get through the country quota in their FIVB Swatch World Tour debut in 2007 (Paris), Jennifer and April won their second event in Stavanger, coming through the qualifier as the 29th seed despite losing two pool play matches.
- Both Jennifer and April have eight FIVB Swatch World Tour gold medals. Jennifer also has a Challenger gold medal with Heather Lowe in 2001 (Pattaya).
- Jennifer and April are the defending FIVB Swatch World Championships gold medalists, winning in 2009 (Stavanger). They finished 37th in their World Championships debut in 2007 (Gstaad), failing to advance through pool play. Jennifer finished 33rd with Holly McPeak in her World Championships debut in 2005 (Berlin).
- Jennifer and April rank fifth (\$772,250 entering Brasilia) on the all-time FIVB money list and are the second ranked American team behind Misty May-Treanor and Kerri Walsh (\$1,540,540).
- Jennifer and April rank eleventh on the all-time FIVB match wins (207 wins, 71 losses) list, passing Nila Ann Hakedal/Ingrid Torlen of Norway with wins in Brasilia.
- Jennifer (\$435,100 entering Brasilia) and April (\$387,625) rank 18th and 22nd in FIVB career earnings, respectively.
- Jennifer was named the AVP's (United States domestic tour) most improved player in 2004.
- April was named the AVP's most improved player and FIVB top rookie in 2007, and FIVB best hitter and best offensive player in 2009.

- Lauren Fendrick and Brooke Hanson are playing in just their seventh FIVB Beach Volleyball Swatch World Tour event together, beginning their partnership in August of last season at the event in Stare Jablonki. They failed to advance past the country quota in two events last season (The Hague and Phuket).
- Lauren and Brooke have already guaranteed their best FIVB Swatch World Tour finish together. Their previous best was a 9th at the Sanya Open last season.
- Lauren and Brooke won the NORCECA Beach Circuit event in Grand Cayman last month.
- Lauren's previous best personal FIVB Swatch World Tour finish was her only previous "final four," a 4th in the Phuket event in 2009 with Ashley Ivy.
- Brooke's previous best World Tour finish was a 5th last season in Brasília with Lisa Rutledge. Lauren has has a 25th and 17th with Ashley Ivy in the 2009 and 2010 Brasília events, respectively.
- Lauren has two FIVB gold medals, both with Ashley Ivy in August of 2008, a Satellite win in Vaduz and a Challenger win in Hacienda Bay.
- Lauren and Brooke are the 35th team to have advanced to a FIVB Swatch World Tour "final four" after qualifying for the Main Draw since 1996. In addition to six gold and ten silver medal finishes for Main Draw qualifiers, another seven teams have earned bronze medals after qualifying for the Main Draw with another eleven qualifiers placing fourth.

The head-to-head series between the two teams is tied at 1-1

- Juliana Felisberta Silva and Larissa França have teamed together for seven-plus seasons since 2004 and rank 10th in FIVB events played together with 85. Juliana also played two FIVB events with Jackie Silva (9th, 25th) and Larissa played four with Ana Richa (17th, 25th, 41st, CQ), and one each with Vivian Cunha (gold), Ana Paula Henkel (5th), and Leninha Aguiar (17th).
- Juliana is playing in her 71st FIVB Beach Volleyball Swatch World Tour medal match with 36 gold medals, 18 silver medals, twelve bronze medals, and four 4th place finishes.
- Larissa is playing in her 72nd FIVB Swatch World Tour medal match with 37 gold medals, 18 silver medals, twelve bronze medals, and four 4th place finishes.
- Juliana and Larissa rank 1st in FIVB Swatch World Tour women's team gold medals with 36 including six in 2005, seven in 2006, eight in 2009 and seven in 2010, passing Misty May-Treanor and Kerri Walsh of the United States last August with their win in Kristiansand.
- Larissa and Juliana rank third and fourth in FIVB Swatch World Tour women's individual gold medals with 37 and 36, respectively, behind Walsh with 39 and May-Treanor with 38.
- Juliana and Larissa put together a 40-match / five-tournament FIVB Swatch World Tour winning streak in 2010, starting with the Bronze medal match in Moscow, and spanning through Stavanger, Gstaad, Klagenfurt, Stare Jablonki, and Kristiansand and finally ending in a gold medal match loss to Chen Xue/Xi Zhang of China in Aland.
- With eight gold medals in 2009, Juliana and Larissa set the record for women's FIVB Swatch World Tour titles in a single season.
- Juliana and Larissa posted silver, bronze, and silver medal finishes at the 2005, 2007, and 2009 FIVB Swatch World Championships, respectively.
- Juliana and Larissa won the gold medal at the 2007 Pan-American games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.
- Larissa was the bronze medal winner at the 2003 Pan-American Games in the Dominican Republic with Ana Richa.
- Juliana won the 2001 FIVB Swatch Junior World Championships for players under the age of 21 in Italy with Taiana Lima. The two teamed to place fifth in the 2003 Junior World Championships in France.
- Juliana and Larissa rank second (\$2,088,450 entering Brasília) on the all-time FIVB money list behind Adriana Behar/Shelda Bede of Brazil (\$2,207,965).
- Juliana and Larissa rank second on the all-time FIVB match wins (463 wins, 81 losses) list behind Adriana/Shelda (587-139).
- The \$409,750 earnings for Juliana and Larissa in 2005 was a FIVB Swatch World Tour single-season record for both men and women, breaking the previous mark of \$332,000 by Emanuel Rego and ZeMarco deMelo of Brazil in 1996.
- Larissa (\$1,198,438 entering Brasília) and Juliana (\$1,050,975) rank third and fourth in FIVB individual career earnings, respectively.
- Juliana and Larissa are five-time FIVB Swatch World Tour champions, winning the season points titles in 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, and 2010. The pair also won the Team of the Year award in all five of those seasons.
- Juliana was named the FIVB Swatch World Tour Most Outstanding Player in 2009 and 2010, Best Offensive Player in 2006 and 2010, and Best Blocker in 2009 and 2010.
- Larissa was named the FIVB Swatch World Tour Most Outstanding Player in 2006, the Best Defensive Player in 2009, Best Hitter in 2008 and 2010, and Best Setter 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, and 2010.

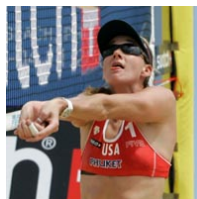

- Misty May-Treanor and Kerri Walsh have teamed together for eight-plus seasons beginning in 2001 and ending with the Olympics in 2008. They are tied for 23rd in FIVB events played together with 60.
- Following the 2008 Olympics, Kerri missed most of the 2009 and 2010 seasons due to pregnancy. She and husband, American Beach Volleyball player Casey Jennings, gave birth to two sons, Joey in 2009 and Sundance in 2010. She played two events in 2010 with Nicole Branagh, finishing 5th in Sanya and winning the gold medal in Phuket.
- Misty was injured in an American Television show (Dancing with the Stars) and missed the entire 2009 season. She played the 2010 season with Nicole Branagh, entering nine events with one bronze medal (Stavanger) and two other top fours (Shanghai and Rome)
- Misty is playing in her 65th FIVB Beach Volleyball Swatch World Tour medal match with 38 gold medals, 13 silver medals, eight bronze medals, and five 4th place finishes.
- Kerri is playing in her 59th FIVB Swatch World Tour medal match with 39 gold medals, ten silver medals, seven bronze medals, and two 4th place finishes.

- Misty and Kerri rank 2nd in FIVB Swatch World Tour women's team gold medals with 35 including five in 2002, five in 2003, six in 2005 and seven in 2007. They were ranked 1st in women's gold medals after the 2008 season but were passed last August by Juliana Felisberta Silva and Larissa Franca.
- Kerri ranks first in FIVB Swatch World Tour women's individual gold medals with 39 and Misty ranks second with 38.
- Since they have not played on the FIVB Swatch World Tour since the 2008 Olympics, Misty and Kerri entered Brasilia with a 69-match / ten-tournament FIVB Swatch World Tour winning streak, starting with the Bronze medal match in Stavanger in 2007, spanning through the remaining six events of the 2007 season (Montréal, Berlin, Gstaad, Klagenfurt, Fortaleza, and Phuket) and all four events they entered for the 2008 season (Berlin, Paris, Stavanger) and culminating with their Gold Medal Olympic victory in Beijing.
- Misty and Kerri are the two-time defending Olympic gold medalists, winning in both Athens (2004) and Beijing (2008).
- Misty and Kerri are three-time FIVB Swatch World Championships gold medalists, winning in 2007 (Gstaad), 2005 (Berlin), and 2003 (Rio de Janeiro). They finished 9th in their World Championships debut in 2001 (Klagenfurt).
- Misty and Kerri rank third (\$1,540,540 entering Brasilia) on the all-time FIVB money list behind Brazilian teams Adriana Behar/Shelda Bede (\$2,207,965) and Juliana/Larissa (\$2,088,450).
- Misty and Kerri rank third on the all-time FIVB match wins (360 wins, 35 losses) list behind Adriana/Shelda (587-139) and Juliana/Larissa (463-81). Their 91.1% winning percentage ranks first all-time ahead of Juliana/Larissa with 85.1%.
- Misty and Kerri's 53-1 match record in 2007 ranks first in all-time season winning percentage at 98.1% with a minimum of 40 wins in a season. They also had a perfect 28-0 match record in 2008 in just four events.
- Misty (\$917,295 entering Brasilia) and Kerri (\$860,820) rank fifth and sixth in FIVB career earnings, respectively.
- Misty and Kerri won the FIVB Swatch World Tour Points Championship in 2002.
- Misty was named the FIVB Swatch World Tour Most Outstanding Player in 2005 and 2008, Best Defensive Player in 2007 and 2008, Best Offensive Player in 2005, 2007, and 2008, Best Setter in 2005, and Sportsperson in 2007, 2008, and 2010.
- Kerri was named the FIVB Swatch World Tour most outstanding player in 2007, Best Blocker in 2005, 2006, 2007, and 2008, Best Hitter in 2005, 2006, and 2007, Best Offensive Player in 2007, and Sportsperson in 2005, 2006, 2007, and 2008.
