

## 2010 SWATCH FIVB World Tour Men's & Women's Highlights & Schedule

The 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** calendar is highlighted by six Grand Slam events as the international Beach Volleyball schedule starts in April and concludes in November.

- The international Beach Volleyball circuit will visit 17 sites in 14 countries over an eight-month period.
- With the 2010 calendar featuring 15 women's and 14 men's events within the Asian, European and South American confederations, the **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** will offer \$6.83-million in prize money.
- Twelve of the tournaments will be combined men's and women's events, including all six Grand Slam stops.
- Women's-only stops will be in China (Sanya), Korea (Seoul) and Thailand (Phuket).
- After a year's absence, the Czech Republic capital of Prague returns to the **2010 SWATCH FIVB World Tour** calendar and will stage the second of two men's-only events in June following the Polish stop in Myslowice in late May.
- With Rome scheduled to host the **2011 SWATCH FIVB World Championships**, the Italian capital will be one of two new Grand Slam events on this year's calendar along with Stare Jablonki, Poland.
- The \$3.6-million **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** Grand Slam series will also return to Austria (Klagenfurt), Norway (Stavanger), Russia (Moscow) and Switzerland (Gstaad).
- Klagenfurt, Gstaad and Stavanger have each staged 10 or more FIVB-sanctioned Beach Volleyball events. All three sites have previously hosted the **SWATCH FIVB World Championships** with Klagenfurt in 2001, Gstaad in 2007 and Stavanger in 2009.
- The opening event on the **2010 SWATCH FIVB World Tour** calendar will be a double gender event in Brasilia April 19-25 as the Brazilian capital will be celebrating its 50th anniversary on the third day of competition. During the April 21 Brasilia celebration, crowds of more than 1-million will be attending various holiday activities around the SWATCH event. Brazil has staged a **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** event every year since the start of the international circuit for men in 1987 and women in 1992.
- China and Norway join Poland in each staging two **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** stops in 2010.
- Mariehamn in the Finnish islands of Åland and The Hague in The Netherlands are also on the 2010 calendar. The two events will conclude the men's international schedule in late August while the women's competition will end in October and November with events in Sanya and Phuket, respectively.
- The international Beach Volleyball calendar will also feature world championships for players under the age of 21. Portugal will host the **2010 SWATCH FIVB Youth World Championships** July 27-August 1 in Porto for players under the age of 19. For the second-straight year, Turkey will host a world finale as Alanya will be the site September 14-19 for the **2010 SWATCH FIVB Junior World Championships** for players under the age of 21. The U19 world championships in 2009 were held in Alanya before England hosted the U21s in Blackpool.
- IMG Sports Media will continue to have the exclusive distribution media rights for the 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour**. A new Mikasa ball, the VLS 300, will be used after being introduced last October and November at events in Sanya and Phuket.

## 2009 SWATCH FIVB World Tour Highlights & Results

Highlighted by the SWATCH FIVB World Championships and four Grand Slam events, the 2009 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** calendar began in April and concluded in November. Here are 2009 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** highlights.

- The total prize money for 2009 was US\$7.2-million.
- The calendar featured 18 sites in 15 countries within three FIVB confederations (Asia, Europe and South America).
- The 2009 calendar included 12 double gender events.
- Italy (Rome) and Poland (Myslowice) hosted men's only events.
- Japan (Osaka), Korea (Seoul), Spain (Barcelona) and Thailand (Phuket) hosted women's only events.
- The 2009 **SWATCH FIVB World Championships** were held June 25-July 5 in Stavanger, Norway. It marked the fifth-time that a European country has hosted the event.
- The 2009 calendar included four SWATCH-FIVB World Tour Grand Slam events with total prize money of \$2.4-million. The Swiss Alps village of Gstaad, which hosted the 2007 SWATCH FIVB World Championships, was the first Grand Slam event followed by stops in Moscow, Marseille and Klagenfurt.
- The 2009 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** calendar featured three new sites, including Brasília (Brazil), Rome (Italy) and The Hague (Netherlands).
- The Finnish event in Aland returned to the 2009 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** calendar after not being held in 2008 due to the Beijing Olympic Games.
- Myslowice hosted a men's **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** stop in 2009 after staging a women's event in 2008.
- Barcelona hosted a women's **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** in 2009 after staging a double gender stop in 2008.
- The FIVB sanctioned two world championships for players under the age of 21. England hosted the ninth annual **SWATCH FIVB Junior World Championships** for players under the age of 21 in Blackpool September 16-20. Turkey hosted the eighth edition of the SWATCH FIVB Youth World Championships for players under the age of 19 in Alanya August 19-23.

## 2010 SWATCH FIVB Junior World Championships

Turkey has again secured a spot on the international Beach Volleyball calendar as the Mediterranean seaside resort city of Alanya will host the **2010 SWATCH FIVB Junior World Championships** for players under 21 years old. It marks the second-straight year that Turkey is staging a world finale after hosting the **2009 SWATCH FIVB Youth World Championships** for players under 19 years old. The 10th annual **SWATCH FIVB Junior World Championships** will be September 15-19 in Alanya, which is located on the Gulf of Antalya and is situated between the Taurus Mountains to the north and the Mediterranean Sea. With a population of more than 400,000, Alanya is part of the Turkish Riviera. The relatively moderate Mediterranean climate, natural attractions, and historic heritage makes Alanya a popular destination for tourism, and responsible for nine percent of Turkey's tourism sector and thirty percent of foreign purchases of real estate in Turkey.

The **2010 SWATCH FIVB Junior World Championships** will mark the 10th annual event as countries within the European confederation have staged eight of the previous nine U-21 Beach Volleyball events. England hosted the 2008 (Brighton) and 2009 (Blackpool) **SWATCH FIVB Junior World Championships** as the country continues to develop the sport prior to the London 2012 Olympic Games. Other European sites for the U21 championships were France (Le Lavandou 2001 and Saint Quay Portrieux 2003), Italy (Catania 2002 and Modena 2007), Poland (Myslowice 2006) and the Madeira Island (Porto Santo 2004). The South American confederation hosted the 2005 event in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

In 2009 at Blackpool, England, Poland became the second country to sweep the gold medals at a single U21 world championship. The Polish pairs of Michal Kadziola/Jakub Szalankiewicz and Monika Brzostek/Kinga Kolosinska topped the podium in Blackpool by defeating men and women teams from Brazil and The Netherlands, respectively, for the gold medals. Brazil swept the gold medals at the 2001 and 2006 **SWATCH FIVB Junior World Championships**. It was the second world championship gold medal for Kadziola and Szalankiewicz as the Polish tandem won the U19 crown in 2007 at Myslowice, Poland. Brzostek placed third at the 2008 junior worlds at Brighton with Karolina Sowala.

Of the nine previous SWATCH FIVB World Championships for players under 21 years old, Brazilians have captured three men's and six women's titles. Pablo Herrera, who won the 2002 U-21 title for Spain with Raul Mesa, captured the silver medal at the Athens 2004 Olympic Games with Javier Bosma. Martins Plavins and Aleksandrs Samoilovs, the 2005 U-21 champions from Latvia, placed ninth at the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games. The Latvians upset eventual 2008 Olympic gold medal winners Phil Dalhausser and Todd Rogers of the United States in their first Beijing match. Brazilian Pedro Salgado, the 2008 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** champions with Harley Marques, captured the 2003 and 2006 U-21 titles with Pedro Cunha and Bruno Oscar Schmidt, respectively.

Russian Alexandra Shiryaeva, who competed in Beijing 2008 Olympic Games, captured the gold medal at the 2003 women's U-21 world championships with Anna Morozova. The Schwaiger sisters (Doris and Stefanie), who placed fifth at the Beijing Summer Games for Austria, claimed the bronze medal at the 2005 U-21 championships.

Francesco Giontella and Paolo Nicolai of Italy won back-to-back U-21 titles in 2007 (Modena) and 2008 (Blackpool). At the 2006 U-19 in Bermuda, Giontella and Nicolai claimed the silver medal with compatriots Matteo and Paolo Ingrosso placing third for Italy. The Ingrossos captured the 2008 U-21 bronze medal.

Marleen Van Iersel realized her gold medal aspirations at a SWATCH FIVB Junior/Youth World Championship event as she teamed with Dutch partner Daniëlle Remmers to capture the 2008 U-21 title for women. Van Iersel was playing in her ninth FIVB Junior/Youth world finale since first competing internationally for the first-time in 2003. A bronze medal winner at the past two worlds for players under the age of 21 with Marloes Wesselink in Italy and Poland, Van Iersel was teaming with Remmers on a FIVB podium for the second-time as the pair was second at the 2006 U19s in Bermuda. Remmers also placed second in 2009 at the U21s with Michelle Stiekema, who was also second in 2008 with Sophie Van Gestel.

## 2010 SWATCH FIVB Youth World Championships

After staging 13 men's and nine women's **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** stops in Espinho, Portugal will again host another "major" international Beach Volleyball event by holding the **2010 SWATCH FIVB Youth World Championships** for players under the age of 19 in Porto, July 21-25. Porto, Portugal's second city and the capital of the Norte region, is located in the estuary of the Douro River in the northern part of the European country. Being the largest city in the region with a population over 1.7-million for the greater metropolitan area, Porto is considered the economic and cultural heart of the entire region. The city of Porto comprises 15 civil parishes and the historic city centre was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1996. One of Portugal's most internationally famous products, Port wine, is named after the city because it is produced in, and shipped from the area.

"These events have been critical to create a new generation of Beach Volleyball athletes," said Angelo Squeo, the FIVB Beach Volleyball Events Director. "In a few years, these players will challenge for **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** medals and vie for berths in future Olympic Games. The winners of these events will also be rewarded by the FIVB and the respective organizers with wild cards and free transportation to take part in the main draw of a **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** event in 2010 or 2011."

While the Brazilian men and women have dominated the FIVB U-21 competition with 14 medals combined, the U-18/19 championships has seen the medal and "final four" count distributed among 20 countries as compared to 17 nations for the junior event. The German men and women have combined to capture five U18/19 gold medals as Christine Aulenbrock and Victoria Bieneck topped the women's podium in 2009 at Alanya. Overall, Germany has 12 combined U18/19 medals and 14 "final four" finishes. Poland ranks second with seven medals and 12 "final four" placements. The Netherlands is other country with multi-U18/19 world titles with a pair of women's gold medals in 2002 and 2007.

The Polish team of Michal Kadziola and Jakub Szalankiewicz gave their country the lead on the men's medal list by capturing the 2007 U-19 title. Estonia claimed its first junior/youth world championship medal in 2008 as the men's team of Kristo Kollo and Oliver Venno claimed the title. Ukraine became the 12th country to win a youth world championship gold medal as the men's team of Sergiy Popov and Valeriy Samoday topped the Alanya podium in 2009

Germany, which was denied a women's podium placement for the first-time in 2007, rebounded in 2008 as Chantal Laboureur and Levke Spinger won the gold medal followed by Aulenbrock and Bieneck's title in 2009. The Netherlands' Danielle Remmers and Michelle Stiekema claimed the 2007 title as the Dutch team of Sanne Keizer and Arjanne Stevens won the first-ever women's gold medal when the competition was for players under the age of 18. The age for the competition was changed in 2005 for players under the age of 19.

With the qualification period for Beach Volleyball at the London 2012 Olympic Games to be determined, the site for the fifth renewal of the Summer Games competition will be Horse Guards Parade. The facility dates from 1745 and takes its name from the soldiers who have provided protection for the monarch since the restoration of the monarchy in 1660. The parade ground lies at the heart of London's ceremonial life, and hosts the Trooping of the Colour event that takes place on the Queen's official birthday each year. Horse Guards Parade lies at the heart of Whitehall, the political centre of the United Kingdom. It is close to Downing Street and across St James' Park from Buckingham Palace. It is a short walk from Trafalgar Square and easy to get to by tube, bus or on foot from the city centre. A temporary arena will be built in 2012 for 15,000 spectators, with sand brought in to create London's very own "beach". The temporary facilities will be taken down after the Games.
