

Mazury Orlen Grand Slam, Hotel Anders, Stare Jablonki, Poland, August 3-8, 2010

Updated on **August 2, 2010**, this fact sheet provides information on the FIVB and the 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour**. The US\$6.83-million **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** is scheduled over an eight-month period starting in April in Brazil and ending in November in Thailand. The US\$600,000 **Mazury Orlen Grand Slam** is the 10th women's event on the 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** calendar. - The seventh Stare Jablonki stop will be the sixth of six **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** Grand Slam events on the 2010 calendar. Brazilians pairs have won five of the six previous Hotel Anders events, including Benjamin Insfran and Pedro Salgado in 2009. Poland is only a "senior" world championship and Olympics away from hosting all the "major" international Beach Volleyball events on the planet. Poland's initial hosting of "major" international Beach Volleyball events started in 2006 by staging the FIVB junior world championships for players under the age of 21 in Myslowice. The next year, Myslowice hosted the FIVB youth world championships for players under the age of 19. Myslowice has continued to host **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** events (women, 2008, men, 2009 and 2010). Stare Jablonki's initial international event was a men's stop in 2004 as the Hotel Anders added women's competition to the program in 2008 to set the stage for its first Grand Slam event this season. France tops the list in promoting "major" Beach Volleyball events by hosting youth (2005, Saint Quay Portrieux), junior (2001, Le Lavandou and 2003, Saint Quay Portrieux) and senior (1999, Marseille) world championships along with **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** Grand Slam stops in Pornichet (1996), Marseille (2001, 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2009) and Paris (2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008).

- The women's **Mazury Orlen Grand Slam** starts August 3 and concludes August 8. The winning team will share the \$43,500 first-place prizes. Here is the schedule:

- A total of 94 men's teams from 31 countries have initially entered the **Mazury Orlen Grand Slam** (as of August 1, 2010), including **Australia, Austria, Belarus, Brazil, Bulgaria, Canada, China, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, France, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Italy, Kazakhstan, Latvia, The Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Oman, Poland, Portugal, Russia, Slovak Republic, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Ukraine, the United States, and Venezuela.**
- The **Mazury Orlen Grand Slam** will be the 254th men's event on the **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** (open, grand slam, Olympic and Goodwill). The first men's **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** event was played February 17-22, 1987 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

- After the Stare Jablonki stop, the final "open" events will conclude the European portion of the **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** season with stops in Norway (Kristiansand, August 9-15), Finland (Aland, August 16-22) and The Netherlands (The Hague, August 23-29). The Hague is the final event of 14 stops for men in 2010. The women's 15-stop schedule concludes in China (Sanya, October 26-31) and Thailand (Phuket, November 2-7).

- About the FIVB** - The Fédération Internationale de Volleyball (FIVB) is the governing body for all forms of Volleyball and Beach Volleyball on a global level. Working closely with the National Federations and private enterprises, the FIVB promotes Volleyball and Beach Volleyball competitions and development activities as entertainment and promotional factors for the enjoyment of spectators and participants while satisfying sponsors' needs. It aims to develop Volleyball and Beach Volleyball as a major world media and entertainment sport through world-class planning and organization of competitions, marketing and promotional activities.

- The television coverage for the 2010 **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** will feature 55 broadcast companies across the world. The coverage covers six macro-regions (Africa, Asia, Europe, North America, South America and the Middle East) with IMG the FIVB's partner for TV distribution and production. A total of 134 "live" matches and 21 highlight programs have been and will be produced and distributed throughout the season offering increased access to each **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** event. The 2009 international Beach Volleyball season saw an increase in international broadcasters from 24 in 2008 to 39 in 2009 when more than 1,600 total hours of primary footage of events were broadcast around the world.

- WORLD TOUR UPDATE** - Entering the final "major" event of the season, Americans Phil Dalhausser/Todd Rogers and Brazilians Juliana Felisberta Silva/Larissa Franca will each be seeking their fourth Grand Slam gold medal in 2010 after winning the men's and women's titles, respectively, this past weekend in Austria at Klagenfurt. Both finals featured teams from the same country featuring the first All-American men's gold medal match since June 2000 in Mexico. Before Dalhausser and Rogers defeated American rivals Matt Fuerbringer and Nick Lucena 21-18 and 21-19 in a 53-minute gold medal match Sunday, Juliana and Larissa topped the Klagenfurt podium by beating compatriots Vivian Cunha and Taiana Lima 21-13 and 21-19 in a 39-minute meeting Saturday in the 44th All-Brazilian women's title match on the **SWATCH FIVB World Tour**. Both gold medal winners at the 14th Klagenfurt event improved their **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** ranking with Dalhausser and Rogers clinching the 2010 point's title for men when the Americans play their first match in Stare Jablonki Thursday. With a team's best 10 finishes for men counting, Dalhausser and Rogers have currently compiled 5,980 points with six gold medal finishes in 2010 along with a second-, third- and fourth-place finish to their credit in nine international appearances together. Juliana and Larissa are currently riding a 22-match winning streak after winning the last three **SWATCH FIVB World Tour** Grand Slam stops in Norway, Switzerland and Austria. With 5,260 points for eight starts this season, Juliana and Larissa hold a "comfortable" lead over nearest rivals Maria Antonelli/Talita Antunes of Brazil (4,580) and Jen Kessy/April Ross of the United States (4,500). For the women, a team's best 11 finishes will be counted towards their FIVB ranking in 2010.

- A new Mikasa ball, the VLS 300, will be used after being introduced at 2009 season-ending events in Sanya and Phuket.
