# VOLLEYBALL World Cup 2003



## A brief history of the World Cups

The first World Cup was played in Warsaw, Poland in 1965 and until 1989 it was an event that put the Olympic medalists to the test just one year after the Games. Three out of six tournaments confirmed the Olympic result while on four other occasions the result was overturned. East Germany, 4th at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico won at home in 1969. In 1969 the USSR, silver medallists from Montreal in 1976, won in Tokyo the year after. Cuba, unplaced in Seoul 1988 won in 1989 in Italy and the Italians, fifth in Barcelona in 1992 won in 1995.

The tournament took on a new look in 1991 when the calendar was modified, making the quadrennial event a qualifier for the Olympic Games.

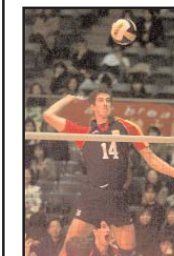
Since 1977, Japan, which brings prestigious sponsors, powerful media and enthusiastic spectators to the World Cup, has been the regular host of this important FIVB event.

## About the tournament

The World Cup is one of three major international Volleyball competitions - together with the Olympic Games and the World Championship - and has been hosted by Japan since 1977, where its excitement and fever engulfs the country every time.

In the World Cup 2003, Men will have its 10th and Women will have its 9th event. Starting from the Opening Ceremony scheduled on November 1st at Tokyo National Yoyogi Daiichi Gymnasium, World cup fever and excitement will take over as the top teams from around the world do battle.

The World Cup serves as an Olympic qualifier, and the World Cup 2003 is the first qualifier for the Olympic Games 2004 in Athens. The top 3 men's and women's finishers will qualify for Athens, as the best teams in the world compete for what is one of Volleyball's supreme events.

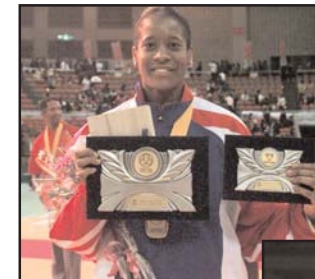

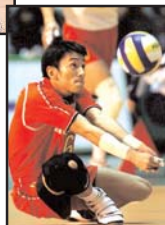

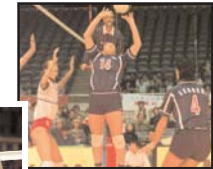

## Rules of the game

Volleyball is a complex game of simple skills. The ball is hit from up to 60cm above the height of a basketball hoop - that's about 3.65m - and takes 0.3sec to get from the spiker to the baseline receiver. That means the receiver must assess incoming angle, decide where to pass the ball and then control the pass in the blink of an eye. A purely rebound sport (you can't hold the ball), volleyball is a game of constant motion.

A team can touch the ball three times on its side of the net. The usual pattern is a dig (an underarm pass made with the forearms), a set (an overhead pass made with the hands) and a spike (the overhead attacking shot). The ball is served into play. Teams can also try to block the opponent's spike as it crosses the net. A block into your own court counts as one of your three touches in Beach Volleyball, but not in Volleyball.

Power and height have become vital components of international teams, but the ability of teams and coaches to devise new strategies, tactics and skills has been crucial for success more recently at international level.

## Competition System

The competition system of the 2003 World Cups for Men & Women is a single Round-Robin system. Each team plays once against each of the 11 remaining teams. Points are accumulated during the whole tournament, and the final ranking is determined by the total points gained.

**Distribution of Points:** Winner = 2 points Loser = 1 point Forfeit = 0 point

## Olympic Games Qualification

The top three teams in the 2003 World Cups for Men & Women will be qualified to participate in the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens.
